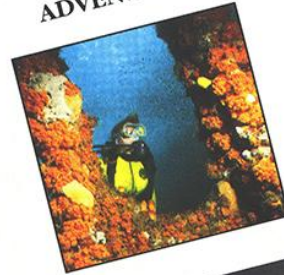

Throughout history, Aruba has beckoned to adventurers; swashbuckling pirates found safe harbor in Spanish Lagoon while waiting to plunder Spanish cargo ships, "gold diggers" sought to make their fortunes here after the discovery of gold on the island in the 1820s and one hundred years later, those who came to the island to refine "black gold" off the Aruban coastline.
